Problem solving and reasoning questions

Draw 5 faces on a bus. Let 2 or 3 people get on. How many on the bus now? Write the addition.

What is five add four?

Use the number line to help you complete the additions below.



Point at the first number and count on.

$$4 + 4 = \boxed{}$$

$$7 + 2 = \boxed{}$$

Problem solving and reasoning questions

Draw 5 faces on a bus. Let 2 or 3 people get on. How many on the bus now? Write the addition.

Either $5 + 2 = 7$ or $5 + 3 = 8$.

Answers 1 less than the actual answer for this and subsequent questions suggest children are including the starting number in the count, e.g. $5 + 3$ by saying 5, 6, 7.

What is five add four? 9.

Use the number line to help you complete the additions below.



Point at the first number and count on.

$$5 + 3 = 8$$

$$6 + 1 = 7$$

$$4 + 4 = 8$$

$$7 + 2 = 9$$
