Flo-Jo Biography

Florence Griffith-Joyner (known as Flo-Jo) was born and grew up in California. From a young age, she was very athletic and soon started attending running track meets. At university in California, she continued to compete in track and field. She attended the Olympics in 1984, where she won a silver medal in the 200 metre distance. During the 1988 U.S. Olympic trials, Flo-Jo set a new world record in the 100 metre sprint of 10.49 seconds. From here, she went on to win three gold medals at the 1988 Olympics. Griffith-Joyner has held the world record for the women's fastest 100m ever since.
