## What Are Rhyming Couplets?

A <u>rhyming couplet</u> is two lines from a poem that are of the same length, that rhyme, and that often complete one thought.

Although rhyming words are words which <u>sound</u> the same when spoken, they don't necessarily have to be <u>spelt</u> in the same way.

Here is an extract from Roald Dahl's funny poem **Little Red Riding Hood and the Wolf**, which is written in rhyming couplets:

As soon as Wolf began to <u>feel</u>
That he would like a decent <u>meal</u>,
He went and knocked on Grandma's <u>door</u>.
When Grandma opened it, she <u>saw</u>
The sharp white teeth, the horrid <u>grin</u>,
And Wolfie said, "May I come <u>in</u>?"
