Off they went, down and down. The owl got out and flew away. 'Goodbye,' he said. 'It was so nice to meet you.'

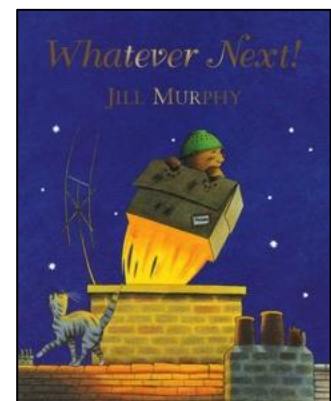
It rained and the rain dripped through Baby Bear's helmet.

6. Why does Baby Bear say that it is a bit boring on the moon?
7. Why does Baby Bear think it is time to go home?
8. What do you think Mrs Bear's voice would have sounded like when she said, 'Look at the *state* of you!' to Baby Bear when he got home?
9. Do you think Baby Bear had really been to the moon or had he just been pretending? Say why you think that?
10. Mrs Bear ends the story by saying, 'Whatever next!' What do you think might happen next?!

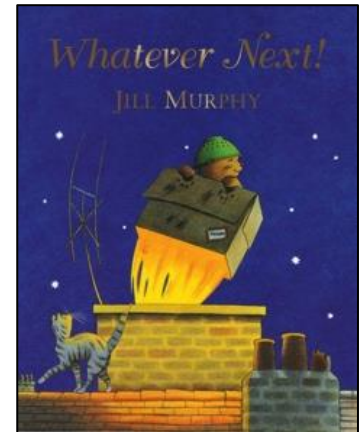
The Story of *Whatever Next!*
