- A note on grammar: the National Curriculum specifies that a sentence is only truly an exclamation when it takes the expostulatory form How... or What..., as in How ridiculous! or What a disaster! A sentence such as But that's totally unfair! is an exclamatory statement rather than an exclamation, although it quite rightly has an exclamation mark instead of a full stop due to the force with which it is expressed. Children will more naturally write exclamatory statements in their work in this Unit but the activities nevertheless reflect the precise requirements for teaching exclamations.
- For Day 2, you will need to have a list of the full names and addresses of all children in the class.
- If you teach children who cannot have their address shared, provide
 Paddington Bear's address in London instead 32, Windsor Gardens, London
 SW3 9LG.
- Each child will then need to have their own name and address (or Paddington's!) on a separate slip for them to copy and memorise.
